

We had such a great day playing in the snow on Monday this week. Look what Xanthia and Nellie made with snow, sticks and rocks – and loads of imagination.

I read that before "snowmen," snow figures were called "snow puppets," or snow dolls. "Snow-man" as a proper title can be traced back to 1827, can you believe that? Making figures out of snow appears to be commonplace during the 14th and mid 18th centuries. During this period, the climate dipped into cooler temperature, and heavy snowfalls were more frequent not like here in Australia.

Interestingly the famous Michelangelo (1475-1564) used snow and created a "very beautiful" snow sculpture in January 1494 for his friend and patron, Piero de' Medici. Snowpuppets, snowdolls, snowmen are all created out of imagination, and often reflect the cultural and societal environment of a time and place. We love to make snow people as objects of fun and play. This enjoyment of nature is something that we all can relate to, young and old, even if we only experience snow once a year. I believe that a snowman always has some element of innocence and whimsy, regardless of what age we make them.


